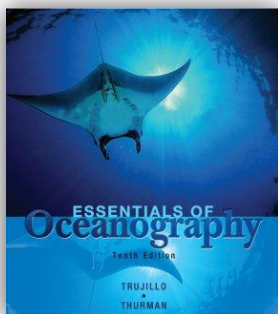

- Beware of buying used copies from private sources: there have been several cases where dishonest dealers advertise a used copy of the text but it is actually a previous edition

FAQs about the textbook

<i>Q: Where can I purchase an electronic copy of the textbook?</i>	A: You can purchase 6-month access to the online version (eText) at MyGeosciencePlace.com for \$94 as opposed to \$154 for a new printed copy. In the eText, you can do some interesting things such as take notes, highlight sections, do global searches, scribble in the margins, and there are direct links to all the key terms (bolded terms). It's really quite useful. If you purchase an online version, you also get access to the Online Study Guide at MyGeosciencePlace.com as well. I'd be interested to know your experience with it if you do purchase an online subscription. You can also purchase an eTextbook subscription at CourseSmart.com for \$57, but it does not come with access to the Online Study Guide (which costs \$30).
<i>Q: Is the textbook available in a Kindle or other digital media format?</i>	A: No, not yet, but that's what is likely going to happen in the next edition. The reason that publisher has not developed this is because the Kindle is not a full-color device. The iPad, however, opens some interesting possibilities.
<i>Q: Can I use the 9th edition of Essentials, or do I really need the 10th edition?</i>	A: The 9th edition will just not do; you'll need the 10th edition, which (among other things) has a whole new chapter on The Oceans and Climate Change (Chapter 16). <i>Q: Who rents the textbook?</i>	A: Among others, these online sites rent the textbook: www.barnesandnoble.com and www.chegg.com Note that rental period and price varies.
<i>Q: What about the International Edition? Is it the same textbook as the US version?</i>	A: It is illegal to purchase the International Edition in the US; it is essentially a bootleg copy. The publisher is aware of the problem and has an active team of piracy hunters that seek to shut down this illegal trade. The textbook is the same version, but don't expect that company or private party to be around for very long. Also, the International Edition does not come with access to the Online Study Guide.

Lastly, if you have documented financial need and cannot purchase a textbook, see me.
